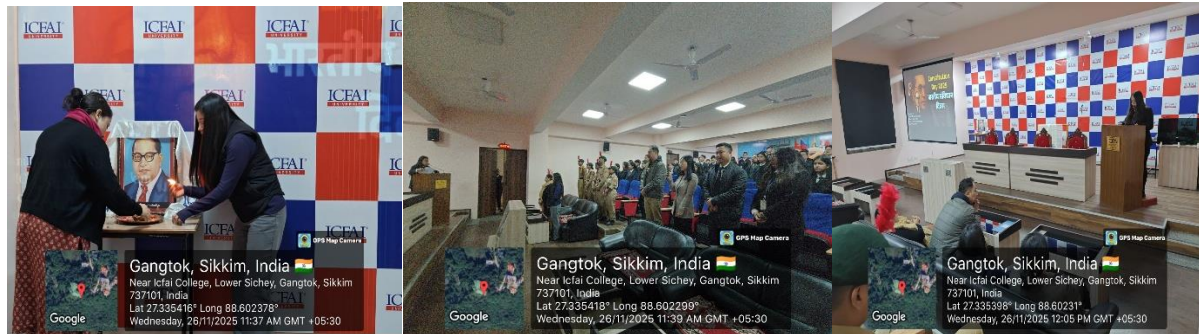


Reaffirming Constitutional Values: Constitution Day Observed by the School of Legal Studies, ICFAI University Sikkim
